
STAKEHOLDER CELEBRATION








HEALTH SCREENINGS Decreased Disease, Increased Resilience



From 2015-2019, MSG conducted a free Health Screening Program.


Over the five years, 26,650 participants were tested and treated for water-related diseases (intestinal worms, amoebas, malaria, and schistosomiasis) and provided with water, sanitation, and hygiene (WASH) education. The test data clearly indicated that people who participate in MSG's WASH education are healthier than those who do not.

The test data clearly indicated that people who participate in MSG's WASH education are healthier than those who do not.


5-Year Intestinal Worm Disease Rates

5-Year Schistosomiasis in Stool Disease Rates












MENSTRUAL HYGIENE HEALTH PROGRAM Continuing to Make Girls and Boys Thrive



This cornerstone MSG program continues to provide a safe learning environment where both female and male students can learn about menstrual and reproductive health, where female students receive resources to manage their menstruation, and where all students are empowered to stay in school and become community leaders and change makers.





MENSTRUAL HYGIENE HEALTH LABS A New Approach in an Original Program





In 2022, MSG piloted MHH Labs in three secondary schools, Sarungi, Katuru and Tai, adding a new approach to the established MHH program.

WASH IN HEALTH CARE FACILITIES



Preventing Healthcare-Acquired Infections



Creating healthier communities is at the center of MSG's work, and our WASH in Health Care Facilities (HCFs) Program is central to this vision. Program highlights in 2022 include:



Disease Prevention Centers (DPCs) continued at five locations, and we added two new dispensaries.

Improving WASH infrastructure continued in 2022, and MSG created a Circuit Rider Program in cooperation with the District Medical Office to ensure sustainability and maintenance of WASH infrastructure and quality of patient care. Circuit riders visit HCFs and do assessments every month to make sure changes are continued and adopted.



WASH IN HEALTH CARE FACILITIES

Changing the Trajectory of Health Care Centers



In 2022, we built:



Two temporary rainwater harvesting systems at the Panyakoo Dispensary (5,000 liters)



Five new latrines with plumbing at the Masonga Health Center



Three new latrines with plumbing at the Panyakoo and Bugire dispensaries



One new incinerator at the Masonga **Health Center**

In 2022, with the generous support from the LUSH Charity Pot, MSG

partnered with the Masonga Health Center to improve WASH facilities.




N Improvements included water supply and treatment systems, latrines, incinerator, and hand-washing stations.



This program has significantly improved the quality of care provided at one of the largest health care centers in the Rorya District.




A WASH Facilities Improvement Team (FIT) was instituted for monitoring and securing long-term functionality of WASH infrastructure and services.

Reaching People Where They Are



Continued Hotline Program for educating people in hard-to-reach areas and men who are often engaged in the workplace during our outreach:

- **1.** Received approximately **1,200** phone calls.
- **2.** Sent approximately **2,500** WASH-related SMS messages.
- 3. 2x calls and messages compared to 2021.



Continued broadcasting health information through the Bunda FM

radio show, doing a total of 12 shows and reaching approximately

15,000 listeners per episode across the Lake Zone and the central regions of Tanzania.

Broadcasted 2 pilot programs on Radio Free Africa (RFA), covering all mainland regions in Tanzania as well as Burundi, Rwanda, Uganda, and Kenya.



Continued social media messaging, reaching approximately **2,000,000** followers (68.1% men and 31.9% women between the ages of 25-34).





MSG's newest and most innovative concept — the WASH Hub — is designed to be a one-stop resource center for rural communities with many essential services under one roof. In 2022, MSG broke ground on construction, drilling a borehole with a solar-powered water pump to provide a safe water source for the community! Additionally, we started building an office, a security house, a laundry block, and a solar-powered energy system to further serve the community.



Future WASH Hub additions will include:



The sales of clean water at an affordable price



Agricultural education, inputs (i.e., seeds and fertilizers), and financing



Sanitation product sales, distribution, and innovation



Hygiene education and supplies (i.e., soaps, water treatment, etc.)

At MSG, we believe that the best way to alleviate poverty is by providing people with technology, education, access to finance, and good WASH infrastructure. The WASH Hub is a holistic and sustainable approach to meeting this vision.



INFLUENCE AT A NATIONAL LEVEL Part of the Conversation



In 2022, MSG continued to influence the WASH sector at a national level by participating in several networks and coalitions to improve the WASH and MHH climate in Tanzania. In addition to sharing our impact and lessons learned with our many partners, we continued to learn from the successes and failures of others.



MINISTRY OF HEALTH'S WASH PILLAR

Within this association, MSG's Executive Director, Rachel Stephen, participated in regular monthly meetings with the aim to monitor disease outbreaks, such as cholera and COVID-19, and help organize cross-sectoral initiatives.

MENSTRUAL HYGIENE HEALTH COALITION

Within this coalition, MSG participated in all quarterly and annual meetings and hosted the interactive MHH Lab at the National Menstrual Hygiene Day celebration in Dodoma.



TANZANIAN WATER AND SANITATION NETWORK

Within this network, MSG continued to be the leading member in the Lake Zone and hosted network meetings.



MAJI SAFI GROUP U.S. A Year of Growth



At its core, MSG in the United States is a fundraising and administrative support arm for the work MSG does on the ground in Tanzania.

On the administrative side, both organizations continued to improve reporting and grant writing collaboration and set new goals to grow the budget to the \$500,000 level and beyond. In addition, MSG has its strongest systems to date for efficiently tracking and reporting program effectiveness from both an impact and a financial perspective.



IN 2022, THE ORGANIZATION SET RECORDS FOR THE AMOUNT OF GRANT MONEY TRANSFERRED TO TANZANIA AND REDUCED OVERHEAD AND FUNDRAISING EXPENSES TO THEIR LOWEST LEVEL IN MORE THAN FIVE YEARS.





The 9thAnnual Maji Safi Golf-A-Thon

The sky was a clear blue, the grass a crisp green, and the enthusiasm palpable when 24 female golfers teed off to support rural Tanzanian communities in the 9th Annual Maji Safi Golf-a-thon.



Even before play began, the event had generated generous support from over 100 donors. By the time the sun had set, the golfers had played 768 holes, made six birdies, scored 1,302 Stableford points, eaten a lot of cobb salad, and raised \$55,000 to support MSG Tanzania!
